Visakhapatnam will be the new Andhra Pradesh capital: CM Jagan Reddy

• Visakhapatnam, a port and industrial city brimming

with cosmopolitan culture has been in the news ever since Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan



Reddy's government announced that it would be the new capital of the state, indicating plans to develop **Amaravati** – on the banks of the **Krishna** river – as the capital city have been scrapped.

- The announcement of **Visakhapatnam**, a **new capital for Andhra** comes nine years after the state of Telangana was carved out of its territory and given Hyderabad as its capital.
- In March last year, the Andhra Pradesh High Court had ruled against the proposal to establish three capitals in the state and directed the YSRC government to develop Amaravati as the state capital as envisaged. The Court had also in its verdict on March 3, 2022 said the state Legislature lacked competence to make any legislation for shifting, bifurcating or trifurcating the capital.

- This is the first budget in 'Amritkal' This Budget hopes to build on the foundations laid in the previous Budget and the blueprint drawn for India@100. Indian economy is on the right track and heading towards a bright future. The Budget 2023 focuses on seven priorities, which the FM called the "Saptrishis guiding us through AmritKaal".

India's 1st Hydrogen train will come by Dec 2023 on Heritage Routes: Railway minister AshwiniVaishnaw

 The Indian Railways is introducing a green revolution and will be introducing hydrogen and

electric trains to the eight routes in country by December The Union Minister for Railways



AshwiniVaishnaw confirmed this recently.

- Talking about this initiative, Vaishnaw added that the new trains will run on the routes of Kalka-Shimla Railways, Nilgiri Mountain Railways, Darjeeling Hills, Kangra Railways, BilimoraWaghai, Mhow-Patalpani, Marwar-devgarh-Madriya and MatheranHill Railways in Maharashtra.
- Hydrogen engines have been developed by a few countries like **Germany**, **France and China**, and now India will also be a part of this, the minister added.
- As a pilot project, the railways is manufacturing a prototype of hydrogen fuel-based train at the Northern Railway workshop. It would be test-run on the Sonipat-Jind section in Haryana.

EknathShinde Declares 'Jai Jai Maharashtra Majha' As State Song

• The Maharashtra government announced the Jai Jai

Maharashtra Majha as the state song, which is usually performed at school cultural events on May 1, second only to the national anthem. The song will now be





- played on official occasions.
- On February 19, the anniversary of the birth of Maratha monarch **ChhatrapatiShivaji**, the song will assume its official role.
- At the moment, 12 other states—Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Odisha, Puducherry, Tamil Nadu, and Uttarakhand—have an official state song.
- Raja Badhe, a poet who worked for All India Radio from 1956 to 1962, composed the song, which Shrinivas Khale set to music.
- It was performed by well-known folk singer **Shahir Sable** in front of **YashwantraoChavan** during a ceremony for the creation of the state on May 1, 1960, at Shivaji Park in Dadar.

- The Headquarters is in India with its Interim Secretariat being set up in **Gurugram**.

PM Modi Emerged as World's Most Popular Leader, with approval rating of 78%

• PM NarendraModi has been pegged as the world's

most popular leader with an approval rating of 78 per cent as per a survey by a US-based consulting



firm 'Morning Consult.' As per the rating PM Modi's ratings trump those of other leaders including US President Joe Biden, French President Emmanuel Macron and UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak. The poll surveyed 22 global leaders for the ratings. Neither Vladimir Putin nor Xi Jinping figured among the 22 popular leaders globally.

- PM Modi garnered 78 per cent of approval ratings, way ahead of US President Joe Biden, who received 40 per cent ratings. Mexican President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador, came in second with 68 per cent ratings and Swiss President Alain Berset occupied the third position with 62 per cent approval rating.
- The list is updated regularly with US President Joe Biden currently ranking number seven. Out of the 22 countries, Norwegian Prime Minister Jonas Gahr Store, South Korean President Yoon Seok-youl and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida ranked among the last three in the list.

YayaTso to be Ladakh's first biodiversity heritage site

• YayaTso, known as birds' paradise for its beautiful

lake located at an altitude of 4,820 metres, has been proposed as Ladakh's first biodiversity heritage site (BHS).



The Biodiversity
Management Committee, the panchayat of
Chumathang village, along with SECURE Himalaya
Project recently resolved to declare YayaTso as
Ladakh's first BHS under the Biological Diversity Act.



• The resolution was signed after multiple rounds of consultations between the village stakeholders and SECURE Himalaya project to declare the high-altitude lake and its catchment as a biodiversity heritage site.

Reliance unveiled India's 1st hydrogen-powered tech for heavy-duty trucks

Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) and Ashok Leyland unveiled India's first Hydrogen Internal

Combustion Engine (H2-ICE) technology solution for heavy duty trucks. This technology was flagged off by PM Modi at the India



Energy Week in Bengaluru.

- The Hydrogen tech solution will emit near zero emissions, deliver performance on par with conventional diesel trucks and reduce noise and with projected reductions in operating costs thus redefining the future of green mobility.
- RIL and Ashok Leyland, along with and other technical partners were engaged in developing this technology since the last year with first engines running in early 2022. The company is also simultaneously pursuing the opportunity to create an end-to-end Hydrogen eco system for mobility.

Centre Notifies Appointment Of 5 Judges To Supreme Court of India, Working Strength Rises To 32

• The Union government notified the appointment of five new judges to the Supreme Court. With their

appointments, the number of judges in the Supreme Court will rise to 32. Currently, the Supreme Court of India has a



sanctioned strength of thirty-four Judges and is presently functioning with **twenty-seven Judges**.

 31 proposal to



Airbus, Boeing and Air India inks agreement for largest purchase in history

compete with regional low-cost rivals and strong Gulf airlines like Emirates, Air India Ltd. has signed deals with Airbus SE and Boeing Co. for



what may end up being the largest acquisition of aircraft in commercial aviation history.

- Under this Anti-Copying Law, a provision to impose a fine of 10 crores rupees along with life imprisonment or 10 years in jail for the copycat mafia. Apart from this, there is also a provision to attach the property of the copying mafia.

Air India to buy 220 Boeing planes for \$34 billion

• United States President Joe Biden hailed Air India's

decision to purchase over 220 aircraft from Boeing and called it a "historic agreement between Tata-owned airlines and Boeing.



- This purchase will support over one million American jobs across 44 states, and many will not require a four-year college degree. This announcement also reflects the strength of **US-India economic partnership**," Joe Biden said in an official statement.
- Air India will purchase as many as 220 planes from Boeing for USD 34 billion, with an option to buy 70





more aircraft that could take the total transaction value to USD 45.9 billion.

The Air India order is Boeing's third biggest sale ever in dollar value and second in terms of number of planes.

12 Cheetahs to be Flown from South Africa Under **Cheetah Reintroduction Program**

Union Environment Minister **Bhupender** Yaday announced Twelve cheetahs will be flown in

from South Africa on 18th February.

Under the ambitious Cheetah reintroduction program, Prime Minister



NarendraModi released the first batch of eight spotted felines — five females and three males from Namibia into a quarantine enclosure at the Kuno National Park in Madhya Pradesh on his 72nd birthday on September 17 last year.

Presently, the eight cheetahs at **Kuno** are killing prey every three-four day and are in good health. One of the cheetahs was unwell as her creatinine levels had shot up. She has recovered after treatment.

- On January 29, Mumbai was ranked 10th in the rankings for the poorest position. Mumbai then clinched the second spot on February 2 before falling in the following days. Then it again rose to take the second place on February 8.
- On February 13, Mumbai took over **Delhi** as the most polluted city in India and was the third most unhealthy city worldwide for air quality worldwide.

- Meanwhile, 13 MPs of the Shinde faction got 73% of the total votes cast in Shiv Sena's favor in the 2019 LokSabha elections, while only 27% of the votes went to MPs from the Thackeray camp.

Tata Group bags Title sponsorship rights for the Women's Premier League to 2027

According to the Board of Control for Cricket in India, the **Tata** Group has secured the title sponsorship rights for the Women's Premier League (WPL) for five seasons (BCCI).



- From February 15, 2023, to July 31, 2027, or up until 30 days after the conclusion of the WPL Season 2027, the salt to software conglomerate will hold the title sponsorship rights.
- On January 28, the BCCI published the tender for the purchase of WPL title rights. The bidding paper could only be purchased until February 9; meanwhile, bids had to be submitted by February 11 to be considered.

Kerala HC publish judgment in regional language, becomes 1st in country to do so

On February 21, also known as International Mother Language Day, the Kerala High Court published two

- The first Law Commission was established during the British Raj era in 1834 by the Charter Act of 1833 and was chaired by Lord Macaulay.

launched "neutral citations" of judgments to ensure a uniform pattern of citing its decisions.



- Earlier, the Supreme court informed that
 - steps had been taken for the introduction and implementation of a **uniform**, **reliable and secure** methodology for identifying and citing decisions in the apex court, namely the neutral citations system, to ensure a uniform pattern of citing all decisions of the top court.
- The Chief Justice of India informed that they have launched **neutral citations**. All judgments of the court will have neutral citations," adding that around **30,000 verdicts** of the apex court would have neutral citations.

Union Government Approved Renaming of Aurangabad &Osmanabad in Maharashtra

Aurangabad city will be renamed ChhatrapatiSambhajinagar, and Osmanabad city will

be called Dharashiv.
After a year the proposal to rename
Aurangabad and
Osmanabad has been approved by



the Ministry of Home Affairs.

- The Ministry stated that it has no objection to renaming cities. The initial proposal was made in a cabinet meeting during the MahaVikasAghadi government in June 2022 before Uddhav Thackeray resigned as the then-chief minister.
- After claiming that the decision by the Uddhav government was illegal, On July 16, 2022, a **Government Resolution** was passed by the two-member cabinet, comprising EknathShinde and his deputy DevendraFadnavis, for changing the names, and a proposal was then forwarded to the Centre.

Nokia updates their logo to mark the beginning of a new era

- 'Irinjadappilly Raman' will help conduct ceremonies at the temple in a safe and cruelty-free manner and thereby support real elephants' rehabilitation and life in forests, ending the horror of captivity for them.

Google introduces AI chatbot 'Bard' to compete with Microsoft's ChatGPT

Google has unveiled an experimental conversation AI service called "Bard", as it races to catch up with the wildly popular chatbot ChatGPT from the Microsoft-

backed firm OpenAI.

According to CEO Alphabet SundarPichai. the service will be initially opened up to "trusted testers"



before making it more widely available to the public in the coming weeks.

This announcement comes as the tech giant's flagship search business faces renewed competition from its Big Tech peer Microsoft which recently made a reported \$10 billion investment in the upstart artificial intelligence (AI) research lab OpenAI and plans to add artificial intelligence capabilities across its range of software products including Google rival Bing.

- The initiative is a particularly significant milestone in the bilateral relationship, having been announced at the highest level by Prime Minister NarendraModi and U.S. President Joe Biden at the Quad summit in Tokyo in May, 2022.
- The two sides announced a set of programmes whose aim is to increase the depth and scope of bilateral cooperation in cutting edge technology, including in the defence sector. The iCET seeks to build supply which increase co-production chains development between the countries and increase linkages between the countries' start-up ecosystems, both governments said in their statements describing the dialogue.

Pakistan's Inflation Rises To 48 Year High as IMF Officials Visit For Talk

Inflation has risen to a 48-year high in crisis-hit Pakistan, where the International Monetary Fund (IMF) is visiting for urgent talks, according to data released on February the 1 by country's statistics bureau.



Year-on-year inflation in January 2023 recorded at 27.55 percent, the highest since May 1975, with thousands of containers of imports held up at Karachi port. Pakistan's economy is in dire straits, stricken by a balance-of-payments crisis while it attempts to service high amounts of external debt.



Food prices rose by a staggering 43 percent in January year-on-year. The inflation rate in Pakistan averaged 8.05 per cent from 1957 until 2023, reaching an all-time high of 37.8 per cent in December 1973 and a record low of minus 10.32 per cent in February 1959.

Adani Group Enters Israel with Haifa Port **Acquisition For 1.2 Billion \$**

- The Adani Group acquired the strategic Israeli port of Haifa for USD 1.2 billion and vowed to transform the skyline of this Mediterranean city as part of its decision to invest more in the Jewish nation, including opening an artificial intelligence lab in Tel Aviv.
- chairman GautamAdani, Adani Group business empire was rocked by allegations of fraud by US short seller Hindenburg Research, appeared alongside Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu for signing of the deal to takeover Haifa Port, and spoke of investment opportunities.
- In July last year, the group anno'unced the acquisition of Haifa Port with a local partner, Gadot, for \$1.15 billion. Prime Minister Netanyahu described the Haifa port deal with the Adani Group as an "enormous milestone", saying it will significantly improve connectivity between the two countries in many ways.

Australia Announced Decision to Remove British Monarchy from its Banknotes

Australia announced it will erase the British monarch

from its banknotes, replacing the late Queen Elizabeth II's image on its \$5 note with a honoring design _



Indigenous culture. The central bank's decision to leave her successor Charles III off the \$5 note means no Britain-based monarch will remain on Australia's paper currency.

The central bank informed that its decision was supported by the center-left Labor government of Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, who supports an eventual move to an Australian republic.

Earthquake of magnitude 7.8 kills 95, knocks down buildings in Turkey

A 7.8 magnitude earthquake shook Turkey followed

by another strong quake which was felt in several provinces in the region, knocking down a number of buildings, reports said.



- The US Geological Survey said quake was centred about 33 kilometres (20 miles) from Gaziantep about 26 kilometres (16 miles) from the town of Nurdagi.
- It was centred 18 kilometres (11 miles) deep, according to the US Geological Survey. Turkey's Disaster and Emergency Management agency was centred in the town of Pazarcik, in Kahramanmaras province.

New British stamp with image of King Charles III

New 'everyday' stamps featuring the image of King

III were Charles unveiled for the first time, the latest item in Britain to get a makeover following the death of Queen Elizabeth.





- From coins and banknotes and to the official royal cypher used by the government, Britain has been slowly introducing replacements featuring the new monarch since his mother's death in September.
- The new stamp, which will go on general sale at the start of April, consists solely of the king's head and its value on a plain coloured background.

Jupiter beats Saturn to become the Planet with most Moons

The battle for the most known moons in the Solar

System is raging on. After losing its lead to Saturn in 2019, Jupiter has once again surged ahead.



- Astronomers have
 - counted 12 previously unknown moons in orbit around our **Solar System's biggest planet**, bringing the known total to **92, and leaving Saturn**, with its measly count of **83**, in the dust.
- The orbits of the moons, which are unnamed, have been published in the circulars of the International Astronomical Union's Minor Planet Center, which keeps records of all the small bodies discovered in the Solar System.





Saudi Arabia to Host Football's 2027 Asian Cup

work of the 33rd Congress of the Asian Football Confederation (AFC), February 1, in the Bahraini capital, Manama. Saudi Arabia was the only bid presented at the Congress in Manama after India's withdrawal in December 2022.

It is noteworthy that Qatar will host the next edition of the Asian Football Cup, from June 26 to July 16, 2023.

Australia's, Aaron Finch retires from International

Australia's longest-serving captain in the shortest format of the game, veteran batter Aaron Finch called time on his international career. Finch, who retired as the One Day International (ODI) captain of the Australian team last year, has confirmed his retirement

from T20Is. Finch guided Australia to its maiden ICC World T20 title in 2021.

Australia's most successful captain in the history of T20I cricket, Finch will continue to play for Melbourne Renegades in the Big Bash League (BBL). Finch's position in the Australian squad came under the scanner after the Men from Down failed to defend its T20 World Cup crown at home in 2022. Hosts Australia failed to make the knockout stage of the T20 World Cup last year.

ICC T-20 Women's World Cup Begins in South Africa

The ICC T-20 Women's World Cup is to begin in South Africa on 10th February 2023, the opening with match between the host team, South Africa and Sri Lanka.



This is the first time that the ICC T-20 Women's World Cup tournament is taking place in an African nation. The Indian team led by HarmanpreetKaur will play their first match against Pakistan on 12th February 2023.

After the Indian team won the inaugural Women's Under-19 T20 World Cup the women's team is in high spirits.

- The launch of the Women's Premier League (WPL), which saw huge valuations in both the media rights auction and the bidding for the ownership of the teams has also lifted the spirit of the Indian team.
- A total of 10 teams will fight for the Women's T20 World Cup 2023 trophy and a total of 33 matches will be played during the mega event.

Gymnast DipaKarmakar Handed 21-Month Ban **After Failing Dope Test**

- Gymnast DipaKarmakar has been handed a 21month ban for failing a dope test conducted by the International Testing Agency.
- DipaKarmakar's dope sample collected out-of-competition by the ITA, which is an independent organization that manages the anti-doping program of the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) was



found to contain Higenamine which is a prohibited substance under World Anti-doping Agency Code.

- The ITA confirms that DipaKarmakar has been suspended for 21 months, effective until 10th July 2023 after testing positive for higenamine.
- The positive sample was collected on behalf of the FIG in the scope of an out-of-competition control on 11th October 2021.
- The Switzerland-based non-profit organization works under the supervision of WADA and the International Olympics Committee to implement Anti-doping programs for various international federations.
- The ITA further informed Karmakar's dope issue was resolved under a case resolution agreement under article 10.8.2 of the FIG Anti-Doping Rules and an equivalent provision in the WADA.

Gary Ballance becomes second player in Test history to set rare record

Gary Ballance, who represented England 42 times three across all formats. scored superb century for **Zimbabwe** on the fourth day of the first Test against West Indies in Bulawayo.



- 33-year-old's The outstanding 137 means he is just the second player in the history of the game to have scored Test centuries for two different countries, following in the footsteps former Australia and South Africa international KeplerWessels. He Test hundreds for Australia and two for South Africa.
- He was the third fastest batter in England men's history to reach 1000 Test runs, but he was dropped in 2017 after a dip in his form.

Indian Golfer Aditi Ashok Won Kenya Ladies Open Title 2023

Olympian Aditi Indian Ashok won the 2023 Magical Kenya Ladies Open Title with a finalround score of 74. This is fourth Ladies' the



European championship of Aditi Ashok overall.

- Her first LET title comes after winning the Fatima Bint Mubarak Ladies Open in Abu Dhabi in 2017. She finished with a score of 12-under 280 at the Vipingo Ridges after shooting a final round of 67-70-69-74.
- The golf player, Aditi Ashok, played one of the most dominant matches of her career.
- She was competing in her first event in over two months, took a three-shot lead in the first round, increased it to five after two rounds, and increased it to six after the third.
- At the end of every round, Aditi kept adding the points on the table that showed a clear lead at the end of the final round.

Cristiano Ronaldo scores four for Al Nassr to cross 500 league goals

England's World Cup-winning captain, Morgan announces retirement from Cricket

Eoin Morgan, who led England to their first-ever ICC Men's Cricket World Cup title in 2019, has

announced his from retirement professional cricket with immediate effect.



Morgan's last appearance came for

the Paarl Royals in the semi-final of the recently concluded SA20 League. Following a 16-year-long career that had begun with Ireland, before he moved to England. He continued to play in various global franchise leagues across the world thereafter.

Morgan aggregated 5,042 runs in first-class cricket, 11,654 in List A and 7,780 in T20s in a professional career that had started back in 2006. One of England's white-ball greats, Morgan remains England's leading run-scorer - 6957 runs in 225 ODIs with 13 hundreds - and the most successful captain in ODIs, with 76 wins from 126 matches he led in.

The team will open its WPL campaign on March 5, the second day of the tournament, against Delhi Capitals at Brabourne Stadium.

FIFA World Cup 2026: FIFA confirms US, Canada, Mexico automatically in 2026 World Cup

The U.S. men's national team, along with **Mexico** and Canada, will qualify automatically for the **2026 FIFA** World Cup.



The three countries won the right to host the World Cup in a united North American bid. FIFA historically has given host nations the right to play in the World Cup without going through the usual qualification tournaments, though this is the first time FIFA had to set aside three host bids.



- The tournament is set to expand from 32 teams to 48 in 2026. Another three berths will be awarded to CONCACAF nations via qualifying.
- While the U.S. and Mexico tend to qualify for most World Cups, it was good news for Canada, whose men's national team broke a 36-year drought between World Cup appearances when it qualified for Qatar in 2022. Canada lost all three of its group-stage matches.
- The FIFA Council also determined its timetable for bidding for the right to host the 2030 World Cup. That meeting will be separate from FIFA's meeting to select a host for the 2027 Women's World Cup, which will be held first, earlier in 2024.

ICC Women T20 World Cup Points Table 2023

- The ICC T-20 Women's World Cup has began in South Africa from 10th February 2023, with the opening match between the host team, South Africa and Sri Lanka.
- This is the first time that the ICC T-20 Women's World Cup tournament is taking place in an African nation. The Indian team led by HarmanpreetKaur.

- The previous sponsor MPL Sports is an athleisure wear and sports merchandise brand from GalactusFunware Technology Pvt. Ltd. The BCCI-MPL Sports kit deal was to last for three years from November 2020 to December 2023.

Rudrankksh Patil Won gold in 10m Air Rifle at ISSF World Cup 2023

- India's **RudrankkshBalasahebPatil** won the men's 10m air rifle event at the ISSF World Cup 2023 in Cairo. He defeated Germany's Maximilian Ullbrich by 16-8 in the gold medal match to clinch the top prize.
- RudrankkshPatil finished seventh in the qualification round with 629.3 points to make the ranking round, which he topped with 262.0 points to set up a final clash against Ulbrich.
- Croatia's MiranMaricic, who topped qualification, won the bronze medal. **Divyansh Singh Panwar** and HridayHazarika narrowly missed out on the cut for the ranking rounds and finished 11th and 12th, respectively.

Each year on February 4, World Cancer Day is


celebrated worldwide. It is believed to have brought everyone together in the fight against cancer.


Every year World on February 10 with an aim to spread awareness about the nutritional and environmental benefits of pulses as part of sustainable food production.



- In 2019, the UN General Assembly dedicated a day to Pulses to increase awareness and access to pulses globally. Pulses also known as legumes, are considered as global foods, and are produced in almost every country.
- 'Pulses for a Sustainable Future' as the theme for the 2023 celebration.
- This year's celebration will highlight the contribution of pulses towards improving soil productivity, increasing the resilience of farming systems, providing a better life for farmers in water-scarce environments, and more. Since pulses have a low water footprint and can better tolerate drought and climate-related disasters, they are imperative to sustainable food production.
