Higher penalties for violating traffic rules come into force

i. The amended provisions of the **Motor Vehicle Act**, which hike the penalty for traffic rules violation have come into force from **01st September**



2019. As many as **63 clauses** of the Act, which correspond to an increase in the fine for traffic rule violation came into force

ii. The fine for jumping red-light has been revised from 1,000 rupees earlier to 5,000 rupees now. Driving without wearing the seat belt, which earlier invited a fine of 100 rupees will now attract a fine of 1,000 rupees.

September month to be celebrated as 'Rashtriya Poshan Maah'

i. The entire month of **September 2019** will be celebrated as the **Rashtriya Poshan Maah**. This year the theme is **Complementary Feeding**.



ii. Prime Minister's Overreaching Scheme for Holistic Nourishment- POSHAN Abhiyaan is a multi-ministerial convergence mission with the vision to address malnutrition with a targeted approach by **2022**.

India's first garbage cafe to be opened in Ambikapur, Chhattisgarh

i. In a unique initiative, the **Ambikapur municipal corporation** of **Chhattisgarh** will open a first-of-its-kind '**Garbage Cafe**'.



ii. This initiative is a step towards making the city plastic-free. In this unique 'Cafe' poor people and rag pickers will get free food in exchange for one kilogram of plastic, while breakfast will be provided if half a kilogram of plastic is brought to the cafe.

iii. The collected garbage will be sold at Solid-Liquid Resources Management Centre. The collected plastic waste would further be turned into granules and will

then be used in the construction of roads in the city. Ambikapur is Chhattisgarh's first dustbin-free city.

"A Short History of Indian Railways" title book penned by Rajendra B Aklekar

i. A new book named "**A Short History of Indian Railways**", has been penned by veteran journalist and author **Rajendra B Aklekar**.

ii. This new book on the history of Indian Railways chronicles the journey of the national transporter from the 1830s to the new high-speed Train 18 and Prime Minister Narendra Modis ambitious bullet train project.

14th Conference of Parties UNCCD begins

i. The **14th Conference of Parties** to the **UN Convention to Combat Desertification** begins in **Greater Noida**.

ii. During the event, **India** also assumed the **presidency** of **COP** for two years and Union Minister for environment took up the role of President of COP.

iii. The Convention started with an aim to combat desertification and mitigate the effects of drought to achieve sustainable development in the affected areas.

ii. This book on the history of Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, earlier known as the North-West Frontier Province (NWFP).

iii. This book presents the chronicles of Congress leadership in 1947 surrendered India's claim on the "tactically important" province despite the resistance of Mahatma Gandhi and some influential political leaders of the region.

Rohit Sharma launches a campaign to save Rhinos in India

i. Indian Cricket team vice-captain **Rohit Sharma** is launching **Rohit4Rhinos campaign**, in partnership with **WWF India** and **Animal Planet**.



This campaign helps to build awareness for the need to conserve the Greater One-Horned Rhinoceros or the Indian Rhino.

ii. The Indian rhinoceros faces several threats, including poaching, habitat loss and mass mortality from inbreeding and disease.

Nadubhagam Chundan Lifts 67th Nehru Trophy in Alappuzha

i. **Nadubhagam Chundan**, the snake boat of Pallathuruthy Boat Club, lifted the 67th edition of the **Nehru Trophy** at the Punnamada Lake in Alappuzha in Kerala. A total of 79 boats, including 23 snake boats, participated in the Nehru trophy.



ii. Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan inaugurated the event in the presence of cricketer Sachin Tendulkar, who was the chief guest of the event.

Delhi's IGI Airport Gets India's Tallest ATC Tower

i. **Delhi's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport** gets India's tallest ATC tower to enhance the safety and boost the efficiency of air transport management services.



ii. The Civil Aviation Minister Hardeep Singh Puri inaugurated the Delhi Air Traffic Service Complex, which is the tallest Air Traffic Control tower in India with a height of **102 metres**.

Delhi, Mumbai fall in EIU's Global Liveability Index 2019

i. Economist Intelligence Unit's Global Liveability Index for 2019, released with both **Delhi** and **Mumbai** sliding down ranks. New Delhi dropped 6 places to 118, from 112 last year and

Mumbai also fell in this year's index, by two places to 119, from 117 last year.

ii. **Vienna** in Austria, **Melbourne** and **Sydney** in Australia make the top three cities. The survey ranks countries across indicators including stability, healthcare, education, infrastructure, culture and environment. **Do You Know-**

India among top 10 nations in gold reserves

i. **India** has surpassed the Netherlands to move into the list of **top10 countries** in terms of total **gold reserves**. According to the **World Gold Council**, India has gold reserves totalling **618.2 tonnes**, which is marginally higher than the Netherlands' reserves of 612.5 tonnes.

ii. According to the World Gold Council, the **U.S.** leads the country list with total gold reserves of **8,133.5 tonnes** followed by **Germany** with **3,366.8 tonnes**. In terms of individual countries, India actually ranks 9th since the International Monetary Fund (IMF) occupies the third position after the U.S. and Germany.

Asia's first 5th Generation: VR based simulator centre launched at Chennai

i. Asia's first 5th Generation – **Virtual Reality based Advanced Driver Training Simulator Centre** was launched at the **Automobile Association of Southern India Centre (AASI)**, Chennai.



In the first 6 months, AASI will train 200 Ambulance drivers free of cost, under '**Safe Drivers Campaign**'. The simulator was ideated, designed and developed by Chennai based Red Chariots Technologies Pvt Ltd.

HRD Ministry awarded Institute of Eminence status to 5 public institutions

i. The **Human Resource Development Ministry** has awarded the **Institute of Eminence** status to **5 public institutions**. The status was awarded to the following institutions:

- IIT Madras
- IIT Kharagpur
- Delhi University

- Benares Hindu University
- University of Hyderabad

ii. Each of the above university has to sign an **MoU** with the HRD Ministry and will lay out its plan to achieve the **objective** of becoming a **world-class institution**. The public institutions on the list will then be **eligible** for a government **grant of Rs 1,000 crore**.

Telangana to celebrate 2020 as Year of AI

i. The Telangana

government has decided to declare **2020** as **Artificial Intelligence year** by organising various activities related to the emerging technology.



ii. A lot of hackathons and meetings will happen and the government agencies will give challenges and make available data sets on which you (companies) can run algorithms.

India moves up 6 places to 34th rank on world travel and tourism competitiveness index

i. According to the **World Economic Forum (WEF) report**, India has jumped 6 places to claim **34th spot** on **world Travel & Tourism Competitiveness Index 2019**.

ii. The WEF report shows, over 1.5 crore international tourists arrived in India while the share of travel and tourism industry was 3.6 per cent and that of industry employment was 5.1 per cent.

iii. **Spain** tops the ranking index followed by France and Germany. Other countries in the top 10 include Japan, the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, Italy, Canada, and Switzerland.

ISRO loses contact with Moon lander “Vikram”

i. **Indian Space Research Organisation** has announced that it **lost contact** with the Moon lander **“Vikram”** which was scheduled to land on the moon between **1.30 a.m. and 2.30 a.m.** (IST).



ii. Further the roll out of the rover **“Pragyan”** was scheduled between 5.30 a.m and 6.30 a.m. Lander

“Vikram” started its descent at about 1.38 a.m. from an altitude of 30 km at a velocity of 1,680 metres per second, but **lost its communication** with the Chandrayaan-2 Orbiter when it was at an **altitude of 2.1 Km** from Moon’s surface.

iii. According to ISRO, the performance of the lander was as per the plan till it was 2.1 km from the moon surface. Although, the 2,379 kg Chandrayaan-2 orbiter continues to fly around the moon. Its mission life is of one year.

iv. ISRO launched the Chandrayaan-2 (on **July 22, 2019**) into the space from India’s heavy lift rocket Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle-Mark III (**GSLV Mk III**). The Chandrayaan-2 spacecraft comprised three segments: the **Orbiter**, lander **‘Vikram’** and rover **‘Pragyan’**.

Visakhapatnam railway station sets up ‘fun zone’

i. A **fun zone**, the first of its kind in India, has been set up by the Railways at the **Visakhapatnam Railway Station**, Andhra Pradesh.



ii. The Gaming zone was inaugurated at platform number 1. The children can enjoy games during their waiting period for trains. The gaming zone has different interesting games for children & adults.

iii. The fun zone will have all the high-tech gaming activities at par with game parlours.

1st Helicopter summit 2019 held in Dehradun

i. The Ministry of Civil Aviation organised **India’s first-ever helicopter summit**

summit in Dehradun. The Indian Air Force was invited at the summit to talk on the “role of IAF helicopters in MEDEVAC (Medical evacuation) at the national level. The conclave was attended by Uttarakhand Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat, the Aviation Secretary, and the Chief Secretary of Uttarakhand.

i. **‘Fortune Turners: The Quartet That Spun India To Glory’**, book on India’s spin quartet has been

launched. The book on India's 4 spin legends: **Bishan Singh Bedi, Erapalli Prasanna, Bhagwat Chandrashekhar** and **S. Venkataraghavan** has been written by **Aditya Bhushan** and **Sachin Bajaj**.

24th World Energy Congress commence in Abu Dhabi

i. The 24th World Energy

Congress commence in Abu Dhabi under the patronage of Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the United Arab Emirates.



ii. World Energy Congress aims to bring together international energy stakeholders, including governments, private and state corporations, academia and media.

iii. The theme of this World Energy Congress is “Energy for Prosperity”.

Book titled “Savarkar: Echoes from a forgotten past, 1883-1924” released

i. A book titled “Savarkar: Echoes from a forgotten past, 1883-1924” is penned by Bengaluru-based historian **Vikram Sampath** and published by Penguin.

ii. This book describing the life of freedom fighter and Philosopher **Vinayak Damodar Savarkar**, popularly known as **Veer Savarkar**.

iii. This first volume of the two-volume series covers the life of Vinayak Damodar Savarkar (Veer Savarkar), from his birth in 1883 to his conditional release to Ratnagiri in 1924.

Times Higher Education released “World University Rankings 2020”

i. World University Rankings 2020, published by the United Kingdom (UK) based Times Higher Education (THE), **Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Ropar** and **Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bangalore** were ranked number 1 among the 56 Indian institutes on the list of the best universities of the world. The ranking includes almost 1,400 universities across 92 countries.

ii. As per the World University Rankings 2020, the **University of Oxford** is the number one university in the world for the fourth time in a row.

The **California Institute of Technology** stands at the second place and the **University of Cambridge** fell to the third rank this year.

Cryodrakon boreas is the largest flying animal of all time

i. Scientists have unveiled a newly discovered species of a pterosaur, the largest ever flying animal according to a study conducted by Queen Mary University in London.



- These species come from the Azhdarchid group of pterosaurs. The pterosaur's name **Cryodrakon boreas** roughly translates to ‘frozen dragon of the north wind’.
- **Cryodrakon boreas** is the largest flying animal of all time, With a wingspan of **10 m and weighing 250 kg**, researchers reported in the Journal of Vertebrate Paleontology.

i. The book titled “The Cousins Thackeray: Uddhav, Raj and the Shadow of their Senas” written by the journalist **Dhaval Kulkarni** was released. It is published by Penguin Random House.

ii. The book depicts the political journey of Shiv Sena president Uddhav Thackeray and Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) chief Raj Thackeray.

Mumbai at 45th spot and Delhi at 52nd in World Safe Cities Index 2019

i. According to a report of Economist Intelligence Unit, **Mumbai** has been ranked as the **45th** safest city on the **Safe Cities Index (SCI) 2019**, while **Delhi** stood at the **52nd** position. **Tokyo** taking the top spot, While **Singapore** and **Osaka** came 2nd and 3rd in the list.



ii. The Safe Cities Index (SCI) 2019 ranks 60 countries worldwide across five continents and measures the multi-faceted nature of urban safety, with indicators

categorised as digital, infrastructure, health and personal security.

St. Vincent and Grenadines, 79th country to join India-led ISA

i. Saint Vincent and Grenadines became the 79th country to join the International Solar Alliance (ISA), an initiative by India aimed at combating the threats of climate change and global warming.

ii. The International Solar Alliance is a group of 121 solar resource-rich countries with headquarters in Gurugram, India. The organisation aims to deploy over 1,000 gigawatts of solar energy and mobilise more than USD 1,000 billion into solar power by 2030, according to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

Kerala to set up India's first iWTC in Kozhikode

i. Kerala will set up India's first international women's trade centre (iWTC), in consonance with the United Nations sustainable development goals (SDGs) in Kozhikode.



ii. A key project of the state's gender park under the department of social justice, it is envisaged as a safe space away from home for women to harness their entrepreneurial capabilities, set up or expand their businesses and get their products marketed globally.

iii. The first phase of iWTC, being executed under the gender park's "Vision 2020", is scheduled to be completed by 2021.

Anurag Kashyap's 'Gangs Of Wasseypur' in the Guardian Best 100 list

i. Filmmaker Anurag Kashyap's **Gangs Of Wasseypur** has become the only Indian film to feature in "The Guardian" list of 100 Best Films of the 21st century. The film has bagged the 59th position.

ii. The two film **Gangs Of Wasseypur** series was released in 2012 and narrated the saga of a coal mafia family in the town of Wasseypur in Dhanbad district of Jharkhand.

iii. Both films were loved by the masses for their drama and rawness and acclaimed by the classes for cinematic aesthetics.

UNESCO to publish anthology of Guru Nanak Dev's writing in world languages

i. The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has decided to translate and publish an anthology of the writings of **Guru Nanak Dev** in world languages to mark his **550th birth anniversary**.

ii. The Government of India is also holding a series of events and has initiated projects to mark 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev.

iii. These include the construction of Kartarpur Corridor from Dera Baba Nanak in Gurdaspur district in Punjab to the international border, the development of the historic town of Sultanpur Lodhi as a heritage town on the smart city principle, the up-gradation of Sultanpur Lodhi railway station and release of commemorative coins and postage stamps.

PM Modi to inaugurate India's second Multi-Modal Terminal in Jharkhand

i. Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** will dedicate to the nation India's **second riverine Multi-Modal terminal (MMT)** built at **Sahibganj in Jharkhand**.



ii. The terminal at Sahibganj will open up industries of Jharkhand and Bihar to the global market and provide Indo-Nepal cargo connectivity through waterways route. **iii.** Coal, stone chips, fertilizers, cement and sugar are other commodities expected to be transported through the terminal.

iv. This is the second of the three Multi-Modal Terminals being constructed on river Ganga under Jal Marg Vikas Project.

India's first central police university to come up in Greater Noida

i. The country's first central police university will be set up by the Union home ministry off the **Yamuna Expressway in Greater Noida**. The Centre had given in-principle approval for the university and a 100-acre plot has been identified in Sector Techzone.

ii. The government wants to set up an institution to tackle modern-day policing challenges. The national university for policing will help in improving police personnel training, skills, research and also policymaking with regard to policing in India.

Hyderabad-Karnataka Region Renamed 'Kalyana Karnataka'

i. Karnataka Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa announced that the **Hyderabad-Karnataka** region has been renamed as '**Kalyana**



Karnataka' and a separate secretariat would be established for its development. **ii.** Hyderabad Karnataka region comprising six north-eastern districts of the State — Bidar, Kalaburagi, Yadgir, Raichur, Koppal and Ballari.

J&K becomes first state to issue highest number of golden cards under Ayushman Bharat scheme

i. **Jammu and Kashmir** has become the first state in the country to issue the highest number of **golden cards** under **Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY)**. Over 11 lakh golden cards have been generated within the first 90 days of the launch of the scheme with 60% of families having at least one golden card which is highest in the country.

ii. Under the scheme, 155 Hospitals including 126 public and 29 private hospitals have been empanelled to provide free and cashless treatment to the entitled beneficiaries while as per Socio-Economic Caste Census (SECC) 6.30 lakh poor and vulnerable families of J&K are entitled to it.

India ranks 9th on "Global Happiness Survey" by Ipsos

i. According to a "**Global Happiness Survey**" by **Ipsos**, **India** has been ranked 9th on the happiness index among 28 global markets. For India, there has been a six per cent drop (from 83 per cent in 2018 to 77 per cent in 2019).



ii. **Australia** and **Canada** at the top spot (at 86 per cent) have emerged as the happiest nations of the world, While **Russia** (47 per cent) emerged at the bottom of the heap, among the 28 markets.

India International Science Festival to be held in Kolkata

i. The 5th edition of **India International Science Festival (IISF)** will be held in Kolkata from November 5-8. IISF is the largest science festival in the world. The focus will be on youth to inspire and motivate them to learn real science in motion. The theme for this year's festival is '**RISEN India –**

Research, Innovation, and Science Empowering the Nation'.

i. The IISF will also host 28 different events such as Agriculture Scientists' Meet, Vigyan Samagam, Young Scientists Conference, Vigyanika-International Science Literature Festival, International Science Film Festival of India.

PM Modi Inaugurates Gandhi Solar Park at UN Headquarters

i. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated a **50 kilowatt 'Gandhi Solar Park'** at the UN headquarters. PM Modi and other leaders also released a commemorative **postage stamp of Mahatma Gandhi**, at the programme "**Relevance of Mahatma Gandhi in the Contemporary World**" at the UN headquarters. **ii.** The event was hosted to celebrate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, which will underline the continuing relevance of Gandhian thoughts and values in today's world.

Maharashtra, Haryana Assembly Elections held on 21st October

i. Maharashtra and Haryana Assembly (Vidhan Sabha) Election 2019 Date, Scheduled on **21st October**, while counting of votes will be held on October 24.



ii. Both Maharashtra and Haryana are the first states to go to polls after the Lok Sabha elections earlier this year. With the announcement, the Model Code of Conduct has come into effect in the two states. Maharashtra, which has a total of 288 assembly seats. Whereas, in Haryana has 90 assembly seats.

Actor Govinda appointed as the brand ambassador of Madhya Pradesh

i. Madhya Pradesh government will appoint filmstar **Govinda** as **brand ambassador** to promote the state's traditions and tourist places. It is Kamal Nath government's intention that the message about the state's traditions and tourist destinations should reach the masses.

ii. The government also has plans to set up a film city in the state and plans to promote Madhya Pradesh as a destination for film making.

Ladakhi Shondol dance creates history by entering into Guinness book of records

i. Shondol dance, which is known as the royal dance of Ladakh, has created history by entering into the **Guinness Book of World Records** as



the **largest Ladakhi dance**. Shondol is a famous dance, which artistes used to perform for the king of Ladakh.

ii. The event was held on the concluding day of the ongoing Buddhist carnival **Naropa festival** near the Hemis Monastery in Ladakh. As many as **408 women** attired in traditional dresses and beautiful headgears performed the dance, which broke the previous record of **299 artists dance** of Shondol in the 2018 festival.

NTPC to build India's biggest solar park in Gujarat

i. India's National Thermal Power Corporation Limited (NTPC) plans to set up a **5-gigawatt solar park** in the western state of Gujarat, which would be the **biggest in the country**. As the top electricity generator shifts toward cleaner energy, which is expected to cost as much as 250 billion rupees (\$3.5 billion) and begin operations by 2024.

ii. The plan is part of NTPC's aim to reduce the share of fossil fuels in the energy mix to 70% from around 96% by 2032.

i. Former president **Pranab Mukherjee** released a book named **'Reset: Regaining India's Economic Legacy'**. The book was written by **BJP MP Subramanian Swamy** that tracks the country's economic development over the years and offers solutions for future growth. The book has been published by Rupa Publications India.

CM Kamal Nath announces Bhopal metro will be named Raja Bhoj

i. Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister **Kamal Nath** announced that the metro rail in Bhopal will be named for **Raja Bhoj**. Raja Bhoj was an **11th-century ruler from the Parmar dynasty** which once ruled the area. **ii.** CM Kamal Nath laid the foundation stone of the Bhopal Metro Rail Project to be built at a cost of about Rs 6,941.4 crore rupees.

India ranked 44th in world digital competitiveness rankings

i. India was ranked **44th** in the **IMD World Digital Competitiveness Ranking 2019** produced by the **IMD World Competitiveness Center**. The **US** was ranked



as the **world's most digitally competitive economy**, followed by Singapore in the second place.

ii. The center measured the capacity and readiness of **63 nations** to adopt and explore digital technologies as a key driver for economic transformation in business, government and wider society.

iii. To evaluate an economy, WDCR examines **3 factors**: Knowledge: the capacity to understand and learn the new technologies; technology: the competence to develop new digital innovations; and future readiness: the preparedness for the coming developments.

International Astronomical Union names asteroid after Pandit Jasraj

i. The **International Astronomical Union** (IAU) has named an **asteroid** after Indian classical singer **Pandit Jasraj**.



The asteroid formally known as a **minor planet**, is located between **Mars and Jupiter**. It was discovered on November 11, 2006, by the Catalina Sky Survey. The privilege of naming a planet is first given to discoverers, who have 10 years to propose a name.

ii. Sangeet Martand Pandit Jasraj is an exponent of Indian classical vocal music. Jasraj is the recipient of numerous awards, honours, and titles, including the prestigious Padma Vibhushan and the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award.

Indonesia to move the capital from Jakarta to East Kalimantan

i. Indonesia's president announced that the country's capital will move from overcrowded, sinking and polluted Jakarta to a site in sparsely populated **East Kalimantan** province on **Borneo island**.



ii. The new capital city, which has not yet been named, will be in the middle of the vast archipelago nation and already has relatively complete infrastructure because it is near the cities of Balikpapan and Samarinda.

Russia to train Indian astronauts for Gaganyaan mission

i. Russia will train **four Indian astronauts** for India's ambitious manned mission to space, **Gaganyaan**.

ii. Indian astronauts will be trained at Russian facilities. A special ISRO unit will be established in the embassy in Moscow to facilitate increased cooperation between India and Russia in view of the Gaganyaan mission.

iii. Under the Gaganyaan Mission, Indian Space Research Organisation has outlined a road map to put a three-man crew in a low earth orbit for 5-7 days by December 2021.

i. The **International Migrant Stock 2019** was released by the Population Division of the **UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA)**. The report provides the latest estimates of the number of international migrants by age, sex and origin for all countries and areas of the world.

ii. As per the report, **India** was the **leading country of**

origin of international migrants in 2019 with a **17.5 million strong** diaspora.

Some important findings of the report:

- The top 10 countries of origin account for one-third of all international migrants. India is the leading country of origin of international migrants with 17.5 million persons living abroad. Migrants from Mexico constituted the second largest diaspora (11.8 million), followed by China (10.7 million).
- Europe hosted the largest number of international migrants (82 million), followed by Northern America (59 million) and Northern Africa and Western Asia (49 million). India hosted 5.1 million international migrants in 2019.
- In India, the highest number of international migrants came from Bangladesh, Pakistan and Nepal.

Sri Lanka flags off Pulathisi Express, a ‘Make In India’ train

i. The tie-up between **India** and **Sri Lanka** received a boost when a newly ‘Make In India’ train “**Pulathisi Express**” rake was flagged off from Colombo Fort Railway station.



ii. The rake of the train was manufactured in the **Integral Coach Factory (ICF) in Chennai**. The train which has been inducted under an Indian Line of Credit has an on-board entertainment system, modular interiors and fully-rotating seats in Air Conditioned Chair cars for passenger comfort.

Water found on potentially habitable super Earth K2-18b

i. Astronomers have found water for the first time in atmosphere of habitable exoplanet **K2-18b** which orbits in its star’s “**habitable zone**”.



ii. K2-18b, which is 8 times the mass of Earth, is now the only planet orbiting a star outside the Solar System, or ‘exoplanet’, known to have both water and temperatures that could be potentially habitable, according to the study published in the journal Nature Astronomy and the lead scientist of the research is **Prof Giovanna Tinetti** of University College London (UCL), United Kingdom.

Typhoon Faxai hits Tokyo, Japan

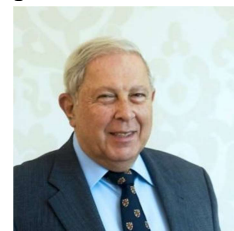
i. **Typhoon Faxai** has hit Tokyo, Japan. There were winds of up to **210km/h (130mph)**. Faxai is one of the strongest typhoons to hit the Japanese capital in a decade. The Authorities have issued non-compulsory evacuation warnings to more than 390,000 people.

ii. The 69 km long pipeline from Motihari in Bihar to Amlekhgunj in Nepal has been constructed by India. This is the first transnational petroleum pipeline form India and **first South Asian oil pipeline corridor.**

iii. The pipeline will ensure smooth, cost-effective and environment-friendly supply of petroleum products to Nepal. The pipeline will save billions of rupees every year on transportation, leakage and expected to make a significant contribution to the prosperity of Nepal and its people.

4th Indian Ocean Conference 2019 held in Male

i. 4th Indian Ocean Conference 2019 was recently held in **Male, Maldives.** Indian External Affairs Minister **S. Jaishankar** was one of the speakers at the Indian Ocean Conference 2019 event.



ii. The **theme** for 4th Indian Ocean Conference 2019 was: **‘Securing the Indian Ocean Region: Traditional and Non-Traditional Challenges’.** This edition of the conference will provide yet another opportunity for stakeholders of the Indian Ocean Region to deliberate on building an institutional framework for managing the threats to regional peace and human security.

Thailand 1st in Asia to roll out plain cigarette packaging

i. Thailand became the **first Asian nation** to unveil **plain cigarette packaging** to reduce the appeal of smoking and complied with the **World Health Organisation’s (WHO)** guidelines.

ii. In 2012, Australia became the first country to require tobacco products to be sold without colourful brand logos.



Vietnam opens Southeast Asia’s largest solar power farm

i. Vietnam has inaugurated **Southeast Asia’s largest solar power farm** which has the capacity to produce **688 million kWh** of electricity annually.

ii. The **Dau Tieng Solar Power Complex**, a joint venture with the Thai industrial group B.Grimm Power Public Company, occupies 540 hectares in Tay Ninh province, Vietnam.

iii. The complex was constructed on the **Dau Tieng Reservoir** the largest artificial lake in Vietnam and is expected to generate 10 per cent of the country’s solar energy to guarantee supply to 320,000 homes.

i. Japan launched an unmanned **H-2B rocket** towards the International Space Station. The **H-2B rocket** lifted off with

cargo vessel **Kounotori8**, Mitsubishi Heavy Industries. **ii.** The launch took place from the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency’s Tanegashima Space Center in southwestern Japan. This Rocket is



considered as the world's biggest transport spaceship. It intends to deliver about 5.3 tonnes of supplies to astronauts at the ISS.

Facebook bags digital content rights for ICC matches in South Asia

i. The **International Cricket Council** has inked an agreement with **Facebook**, under which the social media platform will get **exclusive digital content rights** for select cricket matches in the Indian subcontinent including the Women's T20 World Cup 2020-22, Men's T20 World Cup 2020-21 and the Men's Cricket World Cup 2023.

ii. The social media platform also bagged the rights for match recaps for rest of the world for the next 4 years.

ii. This will be the first time that forces from India and Pakistan will participate in a multilateral exercise together since the Balakot airstrikes conducted by Indian forces.

SLINEX 2019: Indo-Lanka maritime fleet exercise

i. ‘SLINEX 2019’, the bilateral maritime exercise between India and Sri Lanka commenced on 7 September 2019



at Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh). Sri Lankan Navy has sent two offshore patrol vessels SLNS Sindurala and SLNS Suranimala to India to participate in seventh annual Joint Indo-Lanka Maritime Fleet Exercise- SLINEX 2019.

ii. The exercise signifies the desire of both countries to enhance co-operation and to further strengthen mutual trust and interoperability between the two navies.

IAF resurrects 17 Squadron ‘Golden Arrows’ for Rafale

i. The Indian Air Force (IAF) resurrected the Air Force Station (AFS) Ambala-based 17 Squadron ‘Golden



Arrows’, which will operate the first squadron of Rafale fighter jets.

ii. Air Chief Marshal Birender Singh Dhanoa presented a memento to Station Commander Group Captain Harkirat Singh to commemorate the occasion.

iii. Under the command of then Wing Commander BS Dhanoa, Golden Arrows participated actively in Operation Safed Sagar in 1999. On December 31, 2011, the squadron was ‘number plated’ after the

Russian Mig-21 jets that it flew was decommissioned as part of the IAF’s long-term plan to phase the decades-old aircraft out of service and was since awaiting newer inductions.

INS Khanderi to be commissioned into the Indian Navy

i. India’s 2nd Scorpene-class submarine, INS Khanderi will be commissioned into the Indian Navy by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh.



ii. The conventional diesel-electric submarine has been manufactured by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd in Mumbai.

iii. The first Scorpene-class submarine INS Kalvari was commissioned into the Indian Navy in December 2017.

Rajnath Singh becomes 1st Defence Minister to fly in LCA Tejas.

i. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh becomes the first defence minister to fly in the indigenously-built light combat aircraft (LCA) Tejas. He flew in the Tejas fighter aircraft from the HAL airport in Bengaluru. Defence Minister was accompanied by Air Vice Marshal N Tiwari, who is also the Project Director, National Flight Test Centre, ADA (Aeronautical Development Agency) in Bengaluru.

India successfully flight-tested indigenous air-to-air missile Astra

i. Indian Air Force has successfully flight-tested air-to-air missile Astra off the coast of Odisha. The missile was launched from a Sukhoi Su-30 MKI combat aircraft.



ii. The missile was tracked using radars, electro-optical tracking sensors and struck its target successfully. The missile has been developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), the premier research and development organisation of the armed forces.

DRDO hands over second 'Netra' (AEWC) aircraft to IAF

i. The Defence Research Development Organization (DRDO) has handed over the second airborne warning plane, **Netra**, to the Indian Air Force.



ii. The Netra, an **Airborne Early Warning and Control (AEWC) aircraft**, is useful for surveillance, tracking, identification and classification of airborne and sea surface targets and is useful in detecting incoming ballistic missile threats.

iii. The Netra had played a stellar role during the Balakot airstrikes that had been carried out by the IAF in February this year. It provided surveillance and radar coverage to the five Mirage jets that bombed terror launch pads in Balakot in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa province in Pakistan.

Indo-Thailand joint military exercise Maitree 2019

i. India and Thailand are all set to organize **Joint Military Exercise MAITREE-2019 at Foreign Training Node, Umroi**



(Meghalaya) from 16-29 Sep

2019. Both the countries have already conducted two such military exercises in past one month.
ii. About 100 Indian and Royal Thailand Army (RTA) soldiers will participate in the joint military exercise with an aim to share experience gained during a various counter-terrorism operation in their respective countries. The exercise 'MAITREE' is an annual training event which is being conducted alternatively in India and Thailand since 2006.

23rd edition of "Malabar 2019" naval joint exercise of India, US and Japan

i. The 23rd edition of the trilateral maritime exercise of India, Japan and the United States (US) named "**Malabar 2019**" exercise begun at



Sasebo, Japan. India fields 6,100-tonne stealth frigate Indian Navy Ship (INS) Sahyadri, anti-submarine warfare corvette INS Kiltan along with the first-time deployment of Poseidon-8I long-range maritime patrol aircraft.

ii. The United States fields Arleigh Burke-class destroyer United States Ship (USS) McCampbell, amphibious warship USS Green Bay and a Los Angeles class nuclear fast attack submarine, while Japan fields 27,000-tonne Izumo-class helicopter carrier JS Kaga, destroyer Samidare and cruiser Chokai.

India-US Tri-Services "Exercise Tiger Triumph" to be held in November

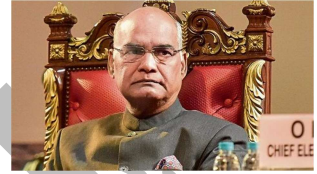

Muhammad Yunus conferred 'Lamp of Peace of Saint Francis' Award'

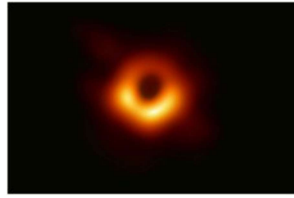

from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

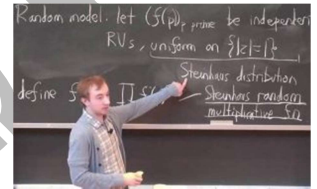
ii. **Swachh Bharat Mission** was launched on **October 2, 2014**, aims to accelerate the efforts to achieve universal sanitation coverage in the country.

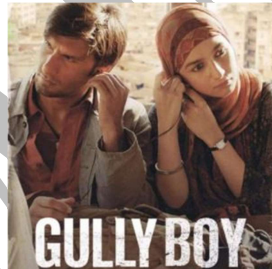

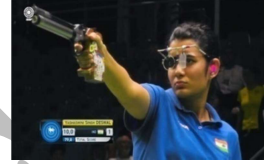

US Open 2019 Concludes: Complete List of Winners

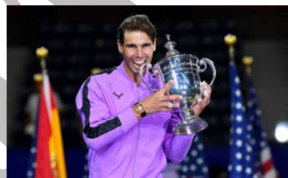

Rafael Nadal beats Daniil Medvedev to win US Open men's final

i. **Rafael Nadal** captured his **19th career Grand Slam title** by winning the **US Open final**, outlasting Russia's **Daniil Medvedev** to seize his fourth crown in New York.



ii. The 33-year-old Spanish left-hander moved one shy of Roger Federer's all-time men's record 20 Grand Slam triumphs.

iii. Nadal, who was in his fifth US Open championship match and 27th Grand Slam final, is the first man to claim five major titles after turning 30.

Bianca Andreescu Clinch US Open Women's Singles Title

i. **Canadian teenager Bianca Andreescu** stunned Serena Williams 6-3, 7-5 to grab the US Open 2019 women's singles title.



ii. The 19-year-old Andreescu becomes the **first Canadian** singles player to win a Grand Slam event.

iii. With the victory, Andreescu also jumps into the top 10 in the WTA rankings. The 19-year-old teen is also the first woman to win the trophy at Flushing Meadows in her tournament debut in the Open era.

iv. Meanwhile, Serena Williams has lost each of her last four Grand Slam finals, all with a chance to tie Margaret Court's record of **24 Grand Slam singles titles**.

Brigid Kosgei runs fastest-ever women's half-marathon

i. Kenya's **Brigid Kosgei** completed the **fastest half-marathon** ever ran by a woman. She won the Great North Run in a time of **1 hour, 44 minutes and 28 seconds**. She took **23 seconds** less than the world record set in 2017 by fellow Kenyan **Joyciline Jepkosgei**.



Lasith Malinga becomes first T20I bowler to claim 100 wickets

i. Sri Lanka's **Lasith Malinga** has become the **first T20I bowler** to take **100 wickets** during the 3rd T20I against New Zealand at Pallekele. He also took a **hat-trick**, dismissing 4 batsmen in 4 consecutive deliveries and became the first-ever bowler to pick up 2 hat-tricks in T20I cricket.



ii. Lasith Malinga also **surpassed Wasim Akram** and set a record for the **most number of hat-tricks** in international cricket. Till now he has claimed 5 hat-tricks in his international career.

Australian fast bowler Megan Schutt scripted history by becoming the first woman to claim two hattricks in white-ball cricket.

i. The right-arm medium-pacer claimed an ODI hat-trick to become the first Australian woman to achieve the feat.



ii. She became the first Australian woman to claim a hat-trick in ODIs. Schutt had claimed her first hat-trick in a T20 game against India.

Pankaj Advani wins IBSF World Billiards Championship

i. Pankaj Advani defeated Nay Thway Oo to win the 150-up format at the IBSF World Billiards Championship held in Mandalay, Myanmar.

ii. This was his 4th straight victory in the final of the 150-up format at the IBSF World Billiards Championship. With this win, he has increased his tally of world titles to 22.

Sourabh Verma clinches Vietnam Open Super 100 title

i. Sourabh Verma has won the Vietnam Open Super 100 title held at the Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Lakshya Sen wins Belgian International Badminton title

i. Indian Badminton star, Lakshya Sen has won the Belgian

International badminton title. He defeated Victor Svendsen of Denmark in the summit clash with a score of 21-14, 21-15. The tournament was held in Leuven, Belgium. Lakshya Sen belongs to Almora, Uttarakhand.

Spain beats Argentina to win Basketball World Cup

i. Spain defeated Argentina by 95-75 to win the Basketball World Cup held in Beijing, China.



ii. This was its second title win after 13 years. The next world cup will held in 2023 in Japan, Indonesia and the Philippines.

iii. Spain had won the title last time in 2006 with a 70-47 win over Greece. Argentina had not triumphed since it hosted the inaugural World Cup in 1950. With 32 teams, this was the biggest Basketball World Cup ever.

Vinesh Phogat wins bronze medal in Wrestling World Championships

i. Vinesh Phogat won the bronze medal at the Wrestling World Championships held in Nur-Sultan, Kazakhstan.



ii. She defeated Maria Prevolaraki of Greece in the 53 kg freestyle event.

iii. Vinesh Phogat has also won India an Olympic quota in the 53 kg freestyle event of Tokyo Olympics.

Beijing 2022: Paralympic and Olympic mascots unveiled

i. A smiling panda and a walking Chinese lantern will be the mascots for the 2022 Winter Olympics and Paralympics in Beijing,



China. The mascots were revealed at a ceremony at the Shougang Ice Hockey Arena in the Chinese capital.

ii. The mascot, named Bing Dwen Dwen, is a chubby giant panda wearing a suit of ice was revealed as the official mascot for Beijing Winter Olympics 2022.

iii. Chinese lantern **Shuey Rhon Rhon** was declared as the official mascot for Winter Paralympics 2022.

Advani-Mehta pair wins “IBSF World Snooker” title

i. The Indian team of **Pankaj Advani** and **Aditya Mehta** to win the “IBSF World Snooker” title. India defeated Thailand in the team event to emerge World champions in the IBSF World snooker team event held in Mandalay, Myanmar.

P.T. Usha honoured with IAAF Veteran Pin

i. Indian track and field legend **P. T. Usha** was presented the **Veteran Pin** by the world athletics governing body, in recognition of her contribution to the growth of the sport. International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) chief Sebastian Coe presented her the Veteran Pin during the 52nd IAAF Congress.



ii. P. T. Usha won five gold medals 100m, 200m, 400m, 400m hurdles and the 4x400m relay besides a bronze at the 1985 Asian Games in Jakarta. Her most memorable performance came in the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics where she became the first Indian to reach the finals of the 400m hurdles but lost the bronze by one-hundredth of a second.

Indian chess player Koneru Hampi wins the Skolkova Fides Grand Prix title 2019

i. Indian chess grandmaster, **Koneru Hampi** of Gudivada (Andhra Pradesh) has clinched Fide World Grand Prix 2019 title with 8 points from 11 rounds in Skolkovo, Russia.



ii. In the final round, Hampi just needs to play a draw for the title. The advantage she has in the final round is that have to play white pieces against the defending world champion Wenjun Xu of China. While other Indian, D Harika secured the sixth place with 5 points.

Manipur wins Senior Women’s National Football Championship

i. **Manipur** defeated Railways by 1-0 to win the Senior

Women’s National Football Championship held in Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh. This was Manipur’s **20th National title**.

ii. **Bala Devi** emerged as the **highest scorer** of the tournament, with **21 goals** from 6 matches, while **Panthoi Chanu** was named the **best goalkeeper**. Both players represented Manipur in the championship.

Rahul Aware wins bronze in 61 kg free-style category at World C’ship i. Indian wrestler **Rahul Aware** has won a **bronze medal** in men’s **61-kilogram freestyle category** at the World Championship in Nur-Sultan, Kazakhstan.



ii. He beat 17th seeded American Tyler Lee Graff 11-4 to ensure he finished on the podium. It was India’s fifth medal at this edition of the World Championships with a total haul of 1 silver and 4 bronzes.

Amit Panghal settles with historic silver in World Championships

i. **Amit Panghal** settled for the **silver medal** at World Boxing Championships after he lost to Uzbekistan’s **Shakhobidin Zoirov** 3-2 in the 52kg category final.

ii. He became the first Indian male pugilist to win a silver in World Championships at Ekaterinburg in Russia.

Bajrang Punia won bronze medal at World Wrestling Championships

i. **Bajrang Punia** won a bronze medal at the **2019 World Wrestling Championships** in Nur-Sultan, Kazakhstan.



ii. He defeated Mongolia’s **Tulga Tumor Ochir** 8-7 to clinch the medal in the **65 kg weight category**.

iii. This is Bajrang’s second consecutive World Championship medal after his silver at Budapest 2018. This is also his third medal at the senior World’s with his first coming in 2013.

Rupa Gurunath appointed as first woman president of Tamil Nadu Cricket Association

i. Rupa Gurunath was appointed as the **first woman president of Tamil Nadu Cricket Association**



(TNCA) at the 87th Annual General Meeting of TNCA in Chennai, TamilNadu. **ii.** With this appointment, she also became the first woman to head a state-level cricket body in the country.

Sumit Nagal wins title at ATP Challenger Tournament

i. Indian tennis player **Sumit Nagal** has won the men's singles title at the **ATP Challenger Tournament** held in Buenos Aires, **Argentina**.

ii. He defeated Argentina's Facundo Bognis by 6-4, 6-2 to win the title. It was Sumit's second Challenger title of his career, following the triumph in the Bengaluru Challenger event in 2017.

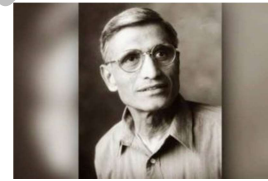
Emmy Award-winning actress Valerie Harper passes away
